Plans to improve communication

- K-ville e-mail list will be expanded and utilized to communicate game policies, K-ville programming, and other information relevant to K-ville to tenters and non-tenters
- Hold several tenting policy information sessions on East Campus to alleviate confusion
- Greater line monitor presence in K-ville to promote communication, unity, and fairness
- Cameron Crazie Counter: the number of DukeCards swiped in Cameron will be posted on the K-ville website and updated every 5-10 seconds
- Frequent Letters to the Editor

Non-Policy Projects and Plans

- Line monitors will replace trash bags more regularly and continuously regulate the cleanliness of Kville
- If K-ville is trashed before a tent check, no grace will be given until it is clean.
- Grace will be granted to a tent if 6 or more members attend certain sporting events, such as Women's Basketball vs. Maryland
- Cheer sheets should exist as a resource – not a guide – to the Cameron Crazies.
- There will be more programming on nights of personal checks to enhance the social atmosphere.

Policy

- Game Policy Classifications: The tenting game is UNC. The senior game is Georgia Tech. Wristband games are the popular weekday games.
- Walk-Up Policy: Groups of up to 6 students may form/join the line at any time, and half or more must be present at all times.
- White Tenting Registration: A random location will be posted on the K-ville website, and groups will be registered on a first-come first-serve basis at that location.
- White Tenting Requirements: 2 people at night and 1 during the day
- Grace Policy: 20 degrees or 2 inches of accumulated snow will *guarantee* grace. However, many other weather temperatures and conditions merit grace.
- Personal checks will be held from 9pm until 8am on two nights.
- Personal checks for Carolina will occur on the weekend before the game
- If anything is being used in a tent that is not battery-operated, it will count as a missed tent check, confiscated, and turned over to Duke Fire Safety
- Tenters will not be permitted to have more than 2 medium-sized tents at any time
- Tarps are not allowed to be stretched over the top of multiple tents
- All students entering Cameron must be wearing a wristband for identification purposes
- Students are ineligible to tent if they were full-time students at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill during the fall 2006 semester.
- If students are using the IM Building for any purpose other than using the bathrooms, it will count as a missed tent check

- Bags and backpacks (aside from small purses) are not allowed in Cameron, and students carrying them will be denied admission
